Curriculum update

Class 1 St John's – This week we have been learning about the life cycle of a frog. We have independently written about each stage and looked carefully at our own tadpoles to work out where they are currently at in their life cycle. We have focussed on capacity in maths; we have enjoyed our learning in the mud kitchen and in our outdoor water tray. We had a very muddy trip to forest school; we linked our learning at the forest with our questions and research about birds. We learnt lots of bird calls, made nests and even spotted a Buzzard hunting! Check out our Class One blog. Can you tell us which birds you have spotted in your garden? We'd love to hear from you!

Class 1 Pott Shrigley – This week in Class 1 we have been looking at non-fiction texts. They have explored the features and gone on to create their own leaflet about pets. In Maths, we have been looking at units of measure for time, capacity and length. In our science lesson we began to look at the properties of materials.

Class 2 St John's – This week in literacy we have written our own set of instructions to direct visitors around Fairy Land. In maths we have worked on how many days in each month, investigating odd and even numbers and solving money problems. In iPC we have been investigating the journey of our food and which processes take place within each part of our digestive systems.

Class 2 Pott Shrigley – In literacy, we have been continuing our persuasive writing topic. We have looked at marketing a holiday destination and put together an argument to save the Rainforest. During numeracy we have practised SATs papers to get used to working in test conditions.

Class 3 St John's – This week in class 3, we have been writing newspaper reports in English. In maths, we have been practising multiplying and dividing numbers by 10,100 and 1000. The Year 6s have been doing a great job working on practice questions. In IPC, we have been looking at volcanoes and earthquakes and how they are caused. Year 6 have been writing an explanation text about them, and year 4 and 5 have designed posters.

Class 3 Pott Shrigley – In maths this week, we have been looking at place value with numbers with 3 decimal places. In literacy, we have looked at the story 'Tuesday' by David Weisner. We are planning a newspaper article. In topic, we have been debating if it is better to go abroad on holiday or stay in the UK?

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
