Drop in workshops are being run on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> February and 18<sup>th</sup> February to make the lanterns.

### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have done a project on the Cheshire artist, Andy Goldsworthy. The children have explored the natural sculptures that Andy creates, focussing on shape, pattern and texture. The children all planned their own sculptures before selecting materials and creating their piece. We have extended our learning by looking at the large trees we have on the school site, focussing on labelling the parts of the trees and recognising each one from the leaves. Our forest school sessions will build on this by looking at the size and age of each tree. In maths, we have revisited subitising patterns of dots up to 6; we have linked this to matching numerals and locating it on a number track.

### **News from Class 2**

This week in Literacy, Class 2 have been reading 'The Grotlyn.' We made a prediction about what the Grotlyn might be, and wrote a description of the setting using adjectives. In Maths, Year 1 have explored numbers 11 to 19 to understand the composition and sequence of each number. Year 2 have continued with addition and subtraction, using concrete resources to subtract a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number. We finished our 'Treasure Islands' IPC topic by learning about famous pirates, writing a wanted poster and designing a pirate island map using symbols.

### **News from Class 3**

This week, the children have started a new maths topic of 'multiplication and division'. We have looked at multiplication of even groups and how to use arrays. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our class book, 'The Matchbox Diary.' They have written their own diary entry about Ellis Island. The children completed their topic of 'Island Life', with a fact file they created using ICT. We have now started our new topic of 'Bienvenue en France'. The pupils have created a knowledge harvest and begun to map the country.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have been learning how to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers by using a common denominator. In Year 6, we have been learning to multiply and divide fractions by integers and find fractions of numbers. In English, we have started to explore the book 'Unspoken' by Henry Cole, and we have been learning how to identify prepositions in sentences. In IPC, we have been designing and making masks inspired by our work on Ancient Maya and Benin.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – In gymnastics, the children have been working on learning new jumps off apparatus including star, tuck and pencil jumps.

Class 2 – This week, the children have been practising balancing skills and jumping using the gymnastic apparatus.

Class 3 – The children have been doing circuits working on core strength, endurance, stamina, flexibility and power. In netball, the children have been working on their chest/bounce manoeuvres.

Class 4 – A week of playing team games outside, focusing on throwing and catching skills and teamwork. Indoors the children played small team netball games.
