News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have introduced our new story, The Bug Collector. We have focused on key vocabulary in the text and had discussions about our own experiences. We have looked closely at the parts of an insect and created pictures of bees to demonstrate our understanding. In maths, we have continued to look at subtraction but now we have used number lines to help us understand how to count back. Sports day has been a real highlight; everyone gave it their best and we are so proud of all the children.

News from Class 2

In English this week, we have continued to explore our 'Send for a Superhero' story by using plurals to make a list of the things our superheroes need for their mission. We also explored adding suffixes -ing and -ed to verbs to spot patterns and find any which were irregular. We wrote an email to the mayor in the story explaining what was happening in the city. In maths, Year 1 have looked at numbers to 100, partitioning into tens and ones using a part whole model. Year 2 have explored finding ¾ in fractions and telling the time past the hour. In RE, we considered how Christians view the effect of the choice Adam and Eve made on our world today.

News from Class 3

In maths, Class 3 have continued to look at time. We have looked at hours, minutes and seconds as units of time. We have also started to solve multistep problems that use time. In English, we have continued to read our class book 'The Story of Tutankhamun' by Patricia Cleveland-Peck. The children have started to express opinion and look at the differences between facts and opinions. They created a set of instructions and began to make inferences about a character. We have continued our topic of 'Temples, Tombs and Treasures' with pupils researching canopic jars and how Egyptian society was structured.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been working on calculating volume, and we have started a project based on designing, and budgeting for, our own theme parks. In English, we have continued exploring Shakespeare's 'The Tempest' by creating our own story boards, including all the key events. We have also identified the relationships between the main characters. We have also continued with our rehearsals for Oliver, our end of year production, and we have been very busy designing and making our well-dressing.
