Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week we have continued with our storytelling theme. We have started independently writing down our stories which has given the children to show off their great ideas and also their phonic skills. In maths we have been focusing on capacity, measuring amounts of water in a range of containers. We have tidied up our allotment area and replaced the soil. We have also planted our vegetable seeds into indoor pots; thank you to Matilda's Mum for all her help with our outdoor projects.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have written letters from a character in our class story and also written a setting description. In maths we have done number sequences and column addition. In topic we have labelled the parts of a flower and learnt about pollination.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, have solved word problems that use time. In literacy we have created, reviewed and edited a newspaper report. In IPC, we have continued our search to create a realistic volcanic eruption. The results of the experiment can be seen on the class web page.

Class 4 – This week, class 4 have been looking at short and long multiplication and division in maths. In English, we have completed our persuasive speeches about an endangered species. In IPC, we have researched tectonic plates and created information booklets. In RE, we have explored symbols of salvation in the church building. In PE, we did circuit training and hockey.

Sports News – Class 1 practised getting out and putting away equipment, moving around obstacles with quoits, beanbags and balls and listening carefully to instructions. Class 2 have practised their passing and rolling skills and also played basketball and practised travelling like different animals. Class 3 looked at ball control skills in football and Class 4 PE consisted of circuit training and hockey.

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
