# **News from Reception**

This week we have used the book The Loon on the Moon to help us learn about the moon and its phases. We have written sentences about the main character and focused on key vocabulary linked to the moon such as crater, crescent, full, half and eclipse. In maths, we have continued our learning of double facts to ten; making ladybirds with moveable wings to reveal sums linked to our dot patterns.

# News from Class 2

In Class 2 this week, Year 1 have been learning about mass in maths. We have explored the weight of different objects and how to balance the scales. Year 2 have continued their work on division in maths and have made good progress! On Thursday, we celebrated International Forest Day by learning about the importance of forests. We also discussed deforestation and how we can help to save the trees. Our computing lesson this week took us on a journey of the different external parts of a computer. We can't wait to continue our learning with technology! Our final Forest School session of the year was fun and filled with outdoor learning - a huge thanks to Mrs L for taking us on the Forest School journey!

#### News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have carried on comparing fractions. Class 3 have continued with our class book 'Black Dog', and we have started to create our own stories using the same format. In art, we worked on frottage to create a flower. In geography, we have started to create a fact file about the Amazon rainforest.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on shape, classifying, estimating and measuring angles. Year 6 have been working on statistics, including dual bar charts and pie charts. In English, we have been exploring Carol Ann Duffy's use of similes, metaphors and personification. Another highlight this week has been exploring the life cycles of amphibians, linked to the tadpoles we currently have in our classroom.
