## Curriculum update:

**Class 1** – This week in Reception we used the children's wonderful holiday diaries as a starting point for discussion. We have talked about holidays, travel and adventures. The children made large scale maps and they have added a range of transport to illustrate how they would get from one place to another. This has encouraged their writing about a journey. In maths the children have started to look at coding and keyboard skills. We all enjoyed our first academy session on Thursday.

**Class 2** – This week in Literacy we have started our new class story called Beegu. We have used adjectives to describe Beegu's planet and tried to translate her alien language. In maths we have done number bonds to 20 using money and ordered three digit numbers. Year 2 have been rounding numbers up and down to the nearest 10. In IPC we have started our new topic of 'From A to B' we have listed all different types of transport that we have been on and thought about some questions we would like answering throughout this exciting topic.

**Class 3** – This week, in maths, children have recapped place value. In literacy we have started a new unit of haiku. Children have created and performed poems. In IPC, we have started our new topic of living together.

**Class 4** – This week, class 4 have been working on investigations and problem solving in maths. In English, we have been writing story openings, focusing on describing settings, creating an atmosphere and using dialogue to portray the characters. In RE, we have started exploring the question, 'Does science disprove Genesis?' We discussed the question, 'How did the world begin?' and listened to varying opinions.

**Sports News** – Class 1 have focussed on hoop skills and gross motor skills. Class 2 have been practising tennis skills. We have learnt the different types of shots and have practising balancing on different body parts. Class 3 have enjoyed a sunny afternoon playing rounders and Class 4 did athletics, focusing on javelin, shot put, long jump and running.

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
