Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week we have continued to focus on what we want to be when we grow up; we have learnt how to care for a baby, teach a class, carry out a science experiment and build a bridge using constriction materials. In maths we have learnt how to count in two's; we have hung pairs of socks on a washing line and matched it to a number line. We have used the terms odd and even to support our learning. In literacy we have focussed on how to ask a question; we decided to set up a question station where we could write out questions for Mrs Stout about our move to Year One. It has been very popular!

Class 2 – In English we have started our new book called the journey. It is wordless so we have become the authors imagining what the story could be about. In maths we have used Venn diagrams to sort different modes of transport and in IPC we have planned a route to the park for our picnic next week.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have worked on recapping different methods of addition. In literacy we have looked at biased and balanced writing. In IPC, children have thought about the local area and examined the physical and geographic features of Bollington. Children have enjoyed a picnic at Bollington Rec as a reward for earning SUPER CLASS.

Class 4 – This week, class 4 have been writing diary entries in character, including memories from the past. In maths, we have been revising fractions, including equivalence, simplification and adding and subtracting by finding a common denominator. We also designed Hope Not Hate posters for 'Remembering Srebrenica', and Mrs Walker came to talk to us about the important work being done by this charity.
