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Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have focused on number bonds to 8 in maths. In literacy we have read the book Stickman; this will inspire our learning for next week. We made our own stick men and discussed the key features of the story. In phonics we have focused on the phase 2 tricky words and sentence structure.

Class 2 – In maths, children have looked at grid method multiplication. In literacy, children have continued to look at persuasive writing and have started to design their own adverts. In IPC, children have designed a model house that will contain two circuits.

Class 3 – This week in literacy we have been writing postcards and diary entries from the different characters in our class story. In Maths we have looked at the faces, sides and vertices of 3D shapes and labelling them. In IPC we visited Fun4All in Macclesfield. We looked at all the different materials that were used to create the soft play area, once back at school we used the photographs we took to give us inspiration to design our own soft play areas which we labelled with all of the different materials we used and gave reasons why we had chosen them. We also built our own class bear out of lots of different materials and each designed a t-shirt for him. The bear will come home with a different child each weekend.

Class 4 – This week, class 4 have been working on converting between analogue, digital and 24 hour clock times and calculating time intervals. In English, we have been reading 'The Unforgotten Coat' by Frank Cottrell Boyce and making predictions and identifying emotions. In IPC, we have researched reflection, absorption and refraction and have learned about light and sound pollution.

Sports News – It's been an exciting week in PE this week. The Reception children had a great lesson in movement, gymnastics, throwing and catching. Class 2 were keeping warm showing off their football dribbling and kicking skills and then they did some fabulous work in gymnastics. Class 3 had a lesson on football and learning about dribbling and certain skills such as the hook turn and drag back. Class 4 were really good this week, having a morning lesson on archery and target shooting, and then played a great intra house football tournament in the afternoon.
