Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have started our new theme of fairy tales. We have enjoyed the story of Cinderella and looked at the differences between the good and bad characters. In maths we have recapped our learning from last term and focussed on recognition of numbers 11-20. The children have shown a great interest in castles after reading our story so we have learnt about the key features of a medieval castle and the designed our own version.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have started our new class story called 'The Journey Home' this book links to our new IPC topic so we have begun by looking at polar bears and how they are adapted to their habitat. In maths we have been ordering the days of the week and months of the year. We have also been looking at how calendars work. In IPC we have all started by asking an interesting question about something we would like to learn by the end of the topic. We have also looked in detail at polar animals.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have looked at multiplying and diving by 10,100 and 1000. In literacy, we have started our myths and legends topic. The first myth that we have looked at is that of Daedalus and Icarus. In IPC, we have started the topic of explorers and adventures.

Class 4 – This week, we have been completing some assessments this week. In English, we have been writing an information leaflet to introduce the Maya area. In maths, we have been revising place value for decimal numbers and ordering decimals. In IPC, we have started our new topic, 'AD900'. We have located the Maya area on a map and labelled the countries that the area includes today. In RE, we discussed the meaning of talents and considered our own talents.

Sports News – It's been a great first week back to PE: Reception had fun lessons on improving their body movement and practicing their throwing and catching skills. Class 2 are really working hard to improve their throwing and catching too. They also had a great time practicing golf putting. Class 3 enjoyed a football lesson, focussing on tackling and shooting, whilst Class 4 focussed on the weight of their swings and strikes whilst playing golf.
