Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have focused on what life is like as a baby. We had a visit from a real baby and we looked at all the essential things that a baby needs to keep them safe and happy. We shared photos of ourselves as a baby and then we matched our names to the photos. We looked at how we've changed since then. In maths we have started looking at the number one. In literacy we introduced the story, 'Wow said the owl' and we learnt all about how to mix each colour in the rainbow.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have started writing our own stories about losing a special toy. We have completed a story map and written a beginning, middle and end. In maths we have looked at counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. In IPC we have been thinking about what we would like to know about toys and we have learnt how marbles are made.

Class 3 – Class Three have enjoyed a great week and in maths this week the children have recapped different addition and subtraction methods. In literacy, the children have continued to enjoy our class book. We have looked at different ways to improve our sentences including using verbs to add description. In IPC, the children have studied the life of Mary Anning. We have created a biography about this famous fossil hunter and discussed reasons why she was not famous during her lifetime. On Thursday, children really enjoyed a great trip to the opera. Check out the news section of our class page to see lots of photos from this exciting day.

Class 4 – This week, we have been writing diary entries in character as Bradley, the main character from our current class book, 'There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom'. We have been working on decimal addition and inverse checking in mathematics. In IPC, we have been looking at adaptive traits of animals and plants which help them to survive in particular environments. In RE, we have been thinking about how Christians may describe God.

Sports News – Classes 1 and 2 have been put to the test moving in different ways, at varying levels and speeds. In the second half of their lessons, they have been balancing and manipulating objects around the hall. Classes 3 and 4 have enjoyed their first week of timetabled sports. Focusing on dribbling skills in both football and basketball, aiming for close control whilst developing speed and the ability to avoid opposition players.
