Curriculum update:


Class 1 – This week in Reception we have looked at the similarities and differences between life in Bollington and life in a Ugandan village. We introduced the book 'Beatrice's Goat' as a starting point for our learning; we will continue this next week. In maths we have focussed on the number 4. We have started to record simple addition sums using numicon. We all enjoyed reading the book 'The Colour Monster' as part of World Mental Health Day; we created our own colour monsters using water colour paint, to show how we feel.

Class 2 – In literacy this week we have looked at homophones and used them in sentences. We have started to plan our own scary story about a creature living under our stairs. In maths we have been looking at chronological order and sequencing our day. We have now moved on to ordering the days of the week. In IPC we have sorted different toys based on their materials and whether or not they are old or new toys.

Class 3 – Class 3 have enjoyed another great week. This week, in maths, children have looked at the properties of 2D shapes. In literacy, we have started our new class book 'The First Drawing'. In IPC, children have researched the Stone Age diet.

Class 4 – This week, in English, we have been writing non-chronological reports about sea-kelp, linked to our current class book, 'The Hidden Forest'. In maths, we have been looking at the properties of shapes. For our well-being day, we explored how we can help look after our own well-being and wrote poems about emotions and feelings. In IPC, we discussed whether or not there may be life on other planets.

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Sports News – Classes 1 and 2 have continued their movement and balancing lessons. This week looking at evading games, aiming to quickly find and move into space. When balancing this week pupils have safely worked on benches. Classes 3 and 4 have focused on shooting skills in both football and basketball, with an emphasis on accuracy over power.
