Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have written letters to Santa asking for something kind for other people around the world. In maths we have focused on one less using a number line. In addition, we have been practicing lots for our nativity next week.

Class 2 – This week has been a very busy week in Class 2. We have written letters of hope and good wishes to Santa and walked to Bollington Post Office to send them. We have looked into the meaning of Christingle and labelled our own Christingles. We have started a science investigation into why two eyes are better than one, we will be carrying out our experiments next week. We have also been very busy getting ready for our Nativity play on Tuesday.

Class 3 – It has been another busy week and children continue to work incredibly hard. This week in maths, children have worked to solve grid method multiplication problems. In literacy, children have continued our book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. Children have written a letter congratulating a golden ticket winner.

Class 4 – This week, in maths, we have been converting between kilometres and metres, and exploring imperial and metric units of measure. In English, we have been writing stories, based on our current class book, 'The Promise'. In IPC, we have been exploring the feelings and emotions that we experience when we listen to different pieces of music.

Sports News - Class 1 and 2 have been working well recapping on different jumps and using them in new situations, including bounces over benches. Everyone worked hard in different groups making sure their team followed the changing rules of the game, with consequences if rules weren't followed. Class 3 enjoyed a fitness skills circuit which focused on speed, catching and explosive hopping. This was followed by a hockey session which saw previously learnt skills put into practice with passing, dribbling and shooting games alongside mini matches.
