#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have continued to use the story of The Colour Monster to inspire our artwork with lino printing and mark making.

We have learnt how to mix the three primary colours to make new colours and relate these to different emotions, just like in the story.

We have continued with our Phase One phonics by focusing on initial sound alliteration.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, in maths, we have focused on place value: representing numbers, and recognising tens and ones. In English, we sequenced the story of Naughty Bus on a storyboard and looked at the different settings throughout the book. In RE, we discussed Good News and looked at examples in our own life. We have also completed an E-Safety lesson on staying safe online. In IPC, we started our topic 'A Day in the Life', looking at different job roles in our community.

### **News from Class 3**

We have had another great week. This week, in maths, we have looked at our 4 key representations. In English, we used our new class book 'Jim: A cautionary tale' as inspiration to write our own cautionary tale. The children have looked at writing rhyming couplets that both have 8 syllables. In IPC, we have started our new class topic, 'How Humans Work'. We have completed our knowledge harvests and glossary.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have continued exploring place value, focusing on adding or subtracting 10,100,1000,10,000 and 100,000 from numbers and rounding integers to any given digit. In English, we have started reading, 'The Boy in the Tower', by Polly Ho-Yen. We have been writing predictions using modal verbs, and have been considering what we would pack and take with us if disaster struck! In IPC, we have started our new unit, 'AD900', completing the Knowledge Harvest and focusing on exploring our key concepts and vocabulary.

#### **Sports News**

Class 1 - In PE, we were pretending to be cars, driving at different speeds and responding to traffic light colours. We also moved to the side for emergency vehicles.

Class 2 – This week, we worked on throwing underarm and overarm at targets, and participated in a group competition.

Class 3 – In PE, we played football, focusing on target practice and our passing skills. In basketball, we worked on our passing techniques and played some team games.

Class 4 – This week, we played football, focusing on passing skills, and then we played dodgeball.
