Curriculum update

Class 1 St John's – This week Class 1 brought in some of their favourite toys and wrote some super sentences to explain why they were special. They carried on making some fantastic toys out of junk modelling and started to create a toy museum in the role play area!

Class 1 Pott Shrigley – This week in Class 1 we have been working on number bonds as well as adding and subtracting 10 in Maths. In English, we have been focusing on using capital letters correctly in poetry whilst continuing to learn our poem. As time detectives we have explored schools in the Victorian times and compared this to the modern day.

Class 2 St John's – This week in literacy we have finished our unusual pat information leaflets. In numeracy we have been looking at pairs of numbers that equal 100. In IPC we have been looking at the different parts of a fish and labelling them.

Class 2 Pott Shrigley – We have been looking at newspaper reports and have written a journalistic style report on Goldilocks and the Three Bears

Class 3 St John's – This week we have continued to read War Horse in English and have used the story to inspire us into writing some wonderful character descriptions. In Maths, we have been using mental methods for subtraction, and we have been learning how brackets work in calculations. In RE, we have been learning about Ramadan and creating fact books using our research.

Class 3 Pott Shrigley – This week we have been learning about Mayan culture and people. In Maths, we have been learning to divide mentally by 8, 5, 20, and 25. In Literacy, we have been reading War Horse. *Daniel Year 5.*
