#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have read the story of Vashti in The Dot; we learned all about trying our hardest and not being afraid to have a go. We created our own dot pictures using watercolour paints before adding patterns in black pen. We have also learnt about the life of Frida Kahlo and how she painted her beautiful self-portraits. We used mirrors to study our own faces before creating our own. In maths, we have focused on 2D shapes in the environment. We created shape finders and went on a shape hunt to find objects in our room that matched. In forest school, we collected plenty of apples ready for some exciting activities next week. Well done to all the Reception children for doing so well with their baseline activities.

#### **News from Class 2**

In Class 2, this week we have been exploring contractions in English. The highlight of the week was our science lesson on Thursday where we were learning outside by exploring how trees change through the different seasons. Year 1 have been learning about tens and ones in maths by using base ten equipment and tens frames, whilst year 2 have explored the topic of greater than, less than and equal to in maths. Also, we have enjoyed preparing for the Harvest Assembly by practising our song every day and using our artistic skills to create some special props!

## **News from Class 3**

Class 3 have had another great week. In maths, we have continued our topic of place value. The children have looked at estimating on number lines, flexible partitioning and adding 1, 10, 100 and 1000. In English, the pupils have enjoyed our class book of 'The First Drawing'. We have created our own story based on this book. We have written in first person, including exciting noun phrases. In history, the pupils have researched Bronze Age Britain. In science, the pupils have continued to look at the human skeleton.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have continued working on place value, focusing on rounding to the nearest 10,000, 1,000, 100 or 10. Year 6 have been revising column addition and subtraction and have been exploring factors of numbers. In English, we have started reading 'The Man Who Walked Between The Towers' by Mordicai Gerstein. We have been writing in character as Philippe, just as he takes his first step onto the tightrope from the top of the tower. A particular highlight of this week has been listening to 'Walk Like An Egyptian' by The Bangles and using pictorial notation to explore its musical composition.
