#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have learnt all about the Hindu festival of Diwali. We have made pinch pot diva lamps out of clay to represent the importance of light in the festival. We have recreated rangoli patterns using chalk on the playground and designed mehndi patterns that are traditionally painted on to hands and arms as part of the celebration. We used the story of Rama and Sita to inspire our drawing and speech bubbles this week. In maths, we have learnt about the part whole model and how we can dissect numbers in different ways.

#### **News from Class 2**

In English this week, we have been exploring the story of Goldilocks and how she should apologise appropriately to the three bears. In maths, Year 1 have explored number bonds to 20 and Year 2 have explored adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers from 100. Our geography lessons are taking us on a wonderful journey of exploration of maps and our surroundings, which, this week, included us drawing aerial maps of our classroom. The highlight of our week is of course using our Mighty Writer for the first time, which has been a massive success! We have also begun practising our Christmas nativity play – standby parents for some important information next week!

#### **News from Class 3**

This week in maths, the children have worked hard to develop their fluency with subtraction. They have practised column subtraction and counting up using a number-line. In English, the pupils have enjoyed our class book called 'Escape from Pompeii', and we have written a persuasive letter. In geography, we have researched tectonic plates. In computing, the children have started to use scratch coding.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week in maths, Class 4 have been working on fractions. Year 5 have been working on finding equivalent fractions and converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions. Year 6 have been learning how to multiply and divide fractions. In English, we have been reading, 'The Unforgotten Coat' by Frank Cottrell Boyce. We have been exploring antonyms and noun phrases linked to the text. A highlight of this week has been our design and technology lessons where we have been learning to make pop-ups and moving parts for the story books we are going to be designing and making for our buddies.
