

Head's Message

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we received a letter from the Weather Fairy; she has asked us to monitor the weather for her over the next few weeks. Each day we have completed our weather diaries and we have checked the temperature, rainfall and forecast for the coming days. In maths, we have focused on staircase patterns and building our understanding of 'one more.'

News from Class 2

This week, we have enjoyed reading further into our English text, 'Dinosaurs and All That Rubbish'. This text has allowed us to consider sustainability, protection of the planet and our aspirations. We have also been writing similes in English with great success. In maths, we have begun deepening our understanding of subtraction. The highlight of the week was creating a map for our school to find a precious item belonging to one of our peers!

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have continued to look at inverse operations. We have used word problems to help our decision making when choosing what operation to use. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our class book 'Escape from Pompeii'. We created the start of our newspaper report. In computing, we used our animation skill to create a story. In geography, the children researched the 'Ring of Fire' and created a fact file.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been mastering using common denominators to add and subtract fractions. Year 6 have been working on measure, converting between units of measure, including between miles and kilometres. In English, we been planning and have started writing our own 'warning' stories. A highlight of this week has been exploring our local area on Digimaps OS maps in our geography lesson. We have worked on using keys to explore the local area, including recreation facilities and transport links.
