News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have used the story of The Messy Magpie as a focus for our fieldwork. We used Digimap and Google Maps to locate the recognisable features around school and then create a route to Tinker's Clough. We added our favourite places to the map and located them during our litter pick. In the woodland, we collected litter and read our story. At school, we wrote speech bubbles for each character in the story and discussed how they felt. As part of Mental Health week, we have focused on empowering the children to share their feelings and understand emotions.

News from Class 2

This week our highlight has been creating our rockets after spending a few lessons designing them on the ipads, which was great fun. We have had a very exciting week. We have created and written our own stories in English based on our class text. In maths, Year 1 have been exploring number bonds and place value, whilst Year 2 have enjoyed learning about multiplication - our progress in maths this week has been fantastic! In science, we explored our senses of taste and touch by tasting different foods and having a mystery item box in our classroom. We have spent some time drawing and creating mini beasts for our new classroom display - our stick insect, Steven, now has some friends!

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have started their new topic of length and perimeter. We have looked at equivalent measurements focusing on millimetres, centimetres and meters. In English, the pupils have completed writing their myths. In history, we have looked at what made the Roman army so effective. In computing, the children have started to film their book trailer, and, in science, they have started to create their own fossils.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on decimals, including tenths, hundredths and thousandths. Year 6 have been exploring decimals, partitioning, rounding and adding and subtracting. In English, we have completed our work on the book, Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race, by Margot Lee Shetterly, writing in character, including feelings and emotions. Another highlight this week has been using Tinkercad in our computing lesson, working on using Computer Aided Design.
