#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have returned to class to find six mystery eggs in our incubator and eight eggs in the blue-tit nest outside in our camera box. We have candled the incubator eggs and learnt about the embryo inside and how it grows. We have researched which animals lay eggs and the common features that they share. In maths, we have been sorting 3D shapes into groups.

## News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our computing lesson where we have started our new topic, International Space Station. Class 2 thoroughly enjoyed learning about the ISS, its purpose and the different components. In English, we have been rhyming words, alien words and phrases. In maths, Year 1 have been learning to measure objects with rulers, and Year 2 have been learning to compare different lengths of lines and objects. In history, we have started learning about monarchs and in PHSE we have been discussing and considering appropriate contact.

#### **News from Class 3**

A very warm welcome back to Class 3! The summer term really has started off with some beautiful sunshine, and we have a fantastic few weeks planned. This week, Class 3 have settled in well and we have started with time in mathematics. In English, we are looking at the book 'Cinderella of the Nile' and what links we can find between the original fairy tale and our book. We had some fun in science and started an experiment with plants and will start tracking the results over the next week.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have completed our work on algebra, solving equations and solving problems with two unknowns. In English, we have been creating our own imaginary animals, and we are in the process of writing our own guide books, telling people all they need to know in order to have one as a pet. In science, we have started our unit about evolution and inheritance, looking at variation within a species, and, in design and technology, we have been exploring beam and arch bridges.
