News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have welcomed our chicks and spent lots of time learning about chick care. The children have loved watching each chick hatching from their egg and comparing them to the eggs of our blue-tit family.

In RE, we have learnt about the recognisable features of a church from the outside and discussed why they are special places for Christians.

In maths, we have continued learning about the properties of 3D shapes before moving on to repeated patterns.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our history lesson. We looked at some historical sources to help us find out about William the Conqueror in 1066. We enjoyed discussing and writing about this historical

event. In maths, Year 1 have been learning to measure in metres and Year 2 have been comparing lengths of objects. In English, we have designed our character and written descriptions of our character. In computing, we have considered what items an astronaut needs to live on the ISS and we used iPads to create a sketchpad list.

News from Class 3

This week brought the sunshine and energy for Class 3. In maths, we have continued with time and started converting between 12-hour clocks to 24-hour clocks. English was a factor of creativity when we discussed the main character and her personality and then created their own character, describing them with similes. In RE we held a discussion focusing on churches, and asking if they are all the same. What is a church? The children have been working very hard and their work is testament to this.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, and how we can calculate perimeter and area of shapes. We have also been exploring coordinates, including reading and plotting in all four quadrants, reflecting and translating. In English, we have completed our guidebooks about how to look after a new, imaginary pet. In history, we have been exploring the historical figures on banknotes, and, in design and technology, we have been making our own bridges and testing them to see how much weight they can support.
