## **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have really enjoyed learning about the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff; we have looked closely at the reoccurring elements of the story, the characters and the setting. We designed our own bridges and built them using a range of materials, considering how to make them more stable. In maths, we have looked at sharing objects between groups, recognising if each group is fair and equal. We are beginning to link this learning to our understanding of odd and even. In RE, we shared our experiences of special times and celebrations. We also welcomed Bev into class to learn about the importance of prayers and how we can create a prayer space in our forest school space.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, our highlight was the art exhibition that we have been taking part in. Class 2 began the week by looking at landscapes and how we can replicate these landscapes with collages made of paper. We trialled using different colours and overlapping paper to produce wild landscapes and then moved on to urban landscapes. In maths this week, Year 1 have been finding halves, thirds and quarters of shapes and amounts, whilst Year 2 have been comparing different fractions and finding fractions of amounts. In RE, Class 2 have been comparing the upbringing of Jesus in Nazareth to our upbringing today. In science, we have been considering how we can reuse different materials to help us produce less waste. We drew, labelled and discussed our ideas.

#### **News from Class 3**

A very warm welcome back to Class 3! What a way to start the week, straight into our art exhibition! Everyone has been exceptionally busy! In maths, we started money discussing pounds and pence as well as the correct way to write it with our symbols and decimal point. English is linking onto our previous story relating to Egypt. The children have shown some amazing thinking skills before we start writing. RE has been a fun topic of discussion as we discovered how and why Christians worship. The best part of the week has been designing our cushions for the art exhibition. The patterns are based on the patterns we find in nature and why we want to preserve the beauty of nature we have.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have been practising telling the time, including converting being analogue, digital and 24-hour clock times, calculating time intervals and reading timetables. In English, we have been completing our stories, inspired the 'The Princess' Blankets' by Carol-Ann Duffy. In RE, we have been exploring the big question, 'What is the nature and character of God?' We have also had a wonderful time creating artwork ready for the art exhibition, based around the theme of recycling, and we have started working on the Leavers' Assembly.
