News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have created a story map to help us retell the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have written speech bubbles and we have started writing our own versions of the story. In maths, we have learnt how to programme the Beebots; we have taken time to plot out a route using instruction cards before setting them off and seeing if we were correct! To celebrate World Ocean Day we created our own prints of fish using recycled materials. These will be displayed at the exhibition this weekend.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our geography lesson where Class 2 have started to learn about China and what it is like to live there. Class 2 enjoyed locating China on a map, discussing the features of China and how it is similar and different to the UK. In maths, Year 1 have been finding a quarter and three quarters of shapes. Year 2 have been exploring how to find a half of an amount and why two quarters is the same as one half. In English, we have been practising using commas and applying them to our writing. In science, we have been learning about how paper is made and why recycling paper is very important.

News from Class 3

This week has been a very busy week in all areas but Class 3 have tackled it head on! In English, we have been working on describing the archaeologist Howard Carter and looking at how we would have written a telegram. Maths has been an exploration of money and working out change. Class 3 had a fantastic time outside after making seeds and testing their theories about how wind affects seed dispersal. We have been looking at rivers in geography, and the children have been on the lookout for what they observe in our local area.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been exploring pie charts and have learned to draw a pie chart. In English, we have completed our stories based on 'The Princess' Blankets' by Carol Ann Duffy, and we started work on our new book which is 'King Kong' by Anthony Browne. In our science lesson, we have been looking the human timeline, describing how humans change from babies to old age, and in geography we have looking at the 8-point compass. We have also been putting in last minute preparation for playing with the Hallé next week.
