News from Reception

Our wonderful new Reception children have settled in so well! This week we have read stories about emotions and recognising how to cope with them when they get too big. We used the story of The Colour Monster to inspire our artwork which led to us exploring colour mixing and creating our own paint colours based on our knowledge. We have loved exploring outside; we have visited the orchard to collect apples ready to bake with and used the climbing frames to develop our balancing and gross motor skills.

News from Class 2

In English, we've been exploring the story *Cave Baby*, using it as inspiration to write our own captions and labels. The children have enjoyed bringing the story to life through their writing. In

Maths, Year 1 have been developing a strong understanding of place value using practical resources such as ten frames, Rekenreks, and cubes. Year 2 have been building on this foundation by learning to write numerals in words with increasing confidence. We've been busy investigating the plants around our school grounds in science. We carried out a bean investigation and even spent time in the school garden helping with the weeding. It's been a hands-on and exciting start to our science learning.

News from Class 3

Class 3 have had a phenomenal week. In maths, we have been looking at numbers and place value up to 10,000. English and history have been a topic of conversation looking back over the ages and specifically focusing in the Stone Age and what it would be like to live in that period of time. Everyone has put a concerted effort into their work this week and have settled beautifully.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Class 4 have been working on place value. We have been extending this learning to numbers up to 10,000,000. In English, we have started reading 'The Man Who Walked Between the Towers' by Mordicai Gerstein. We have been writing about the history of the Twin Towers, focusing on using pronouns and noun phrases to avoid repetition in our writing. Highlights of this week have been starting our new RE unit, which asks is every person's journey the same? We have also been learning about the areas of regulation in PSHE.

This would evolve into playing passes and dribbling the football. In basketball, the children were practising how to dribble using alternate hands and learning to change direction and turn.

After six games of two minutes, we would have a winning team. They then went onto a new passing game involving hitting cones and football from 10-40 yards away.
