## **News from Reception**

It has been a fun filled week in Reception this week! We have read the story of Vashti in the Dot, and it has inspired some beautiful artwork using circles and lots of different media; this linked to our exploration of other 2D shapes and line patterns in maths. We learnt all about the life and work of Frida Kahlo before following her technique of studying our faces using a mirror and then creating a self-portrait. In RE, we have focused on what we are good at and reflecting on how this makes us special. We have started our baseline assessments, and we are so proud of how amazing our new Reception children are turning out to be.

### **News from Class 2**

This week, in English, we've been focusing on using capital letters, full stops, and exciting adjectives to improve our writing. We even had fun stomping on full stops—just like Cave Baby! In maths, we explored number lines and practised estimating by finding what number lies halfway along the line. It was a great way to sharpen our number sense! In history, we shared and discussed some of our favourite memories, helping us understand the importance of personal history. We ended the week with a fantastic trip to White Nancy, which linked to our science lessons. While enjoying the local landscape, we took a closer look at the plants that grow in our area and learned more about our natural environment.

#### **News from Class 3**

What a week it has been for Class 3. We have been working very hard at planning our English story we are going to write. The Stone Age has been a fantastic topic of discussion over the week. In maths, we have been using Base 10 to solve some tricky problems. Science has been all about shadows and lights. The children are getting really good at identifying objects that are transparent, translucent and opaque. We made our very own French puppets which we will be using to practise our greetings and responses. A very successful week of learning!

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have continued working on place value, focusing on numbers to 10,000,000 and multiplication and division by 10, 100 and 1,000. In English, we have continued reading 'The Man Who Walked Between The Towers' by Mordicai Gerstein. We have been writing expanded noun phrases to describe now Philippe would feel stepping out onto the rope between the towers, and we have started writing diary entries in character as Philippe. A particular highlight of this week has been listening to 'Walk Like An Egyptian' by The Bangles and using pictorial notation to explore its musical composition.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – The children focused on our listening skills with two stop/start games. We moved in different ways and developed our coordination by changing direction and being aware of our surroundings.

Class 2 – This week, Class 2 were playing target practice games, taking turns to roll their ball through a gate (two cones) to reach their partner. We then put a hoop in the middle of pairs and practised rolling with different weights to land the ball in the middle of the hoop.

Class 3 – In PE this week, Class 3 competed in different races and activities to use agility, balance and control. The children then split into groups and used seven different size balls all with different weights and practised rolling games and to complete and record scores.

Class 4 – Class 4 had swimming, and when we arrived back to school, we played a line ball tournament. This focused on teamwork, communication and attitude.
