#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception we have read the wonderful text, 'Martha Maps It Out' to inspire our learning. We have created our own maps using photographs of places that we recognise in Bollington. In maths, we have been finding different ways to sort a group of objects; this made us think really carefully about the common features of each set of objects.

In RE, we focused on the people in our community that help us; we reflected on how we can help our friends. We loved reading poetry for National Poetry Day on Thursday; our favourite was 'The Duck' which everyone found very funny!

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, we've been busy building on our understanding of numbers to 10 and 20, with a strong focus on reinforcing place value. In English, we began exploring our new book *Yeti and the Bird*. The children have been captivated by the story and have written thoughtful and creative letters to Yeti, offering him advice in his search for friendship. Our science topic on plants has continued to bloom! We've been identifying wild and garden flowers, and we extended our learning by discovering the work of botanical artist Anna Atkins. Inspired by her unique style, the children created their own beautiful botanical artworks. To finish the week, we stepped back in time and had great fun playing traditional playground games!

#### **News from Class 3**

Class 3 has had a wonderful week. In maths, we ended off our week by cracking the code with Roman numerals. The children have done such fantastic writing in English this week, writing a first-person paragraph and comparing man-made structures vs nature from our book the Varmints. History has been ever so fun, looking at different artefacts and thinking about what they are or what they were used for. We had a look at Islam faith in RE and have explored what is similar and different to the Christian faith.

#### News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been learning to order and compare negative numbers and find the difference between positive and negative integers. In English, we have completed our diary entries based on 'The Man Who Walked Between The Towers' by Mordicai Gerstein. Other highlights this

week have been our science lesson, exploring filtering, and our Wonderful World workshop by Sewing Seeds, exploring the creation story and how we can be good custodians of the planet.

#### **Sports News**

Class 1 – The class were focusing on listening to instructions and stop start games, using cones as steering wheels and moving around at different speeds and looking out for traffic lights and signals. They then moved onto awareness games in spaces.

Class 2 – This week, we split the class into two groups. One group would be on the field practising dribbling a football around and being able to keep control, stopping and starting to move. We moved onto dribbling through space without bumping into planets 'cones'. The other group were on the playground using hoops, ropes, bean bags, chalk and other items to improve their gross motor skills. The children then swapped groups.

Class 3 – In PE, we split the class into two and one half of the class played and learned how to be involved in a football match and how to find space. The second half of the class were playing line ball and practising how to pass and move and find space. The classes then swapped.

Class 4 – This week, Class 4 were swimming in the morning and then came back to play 'table football'. The children were spread out on the playground and could only turn, pass, block and shoot. The children were unable to move around, using communication to score. To progress the children then had a small rope to hold to move sideways like table football.
